Troy Duster Speaks To Activism At UIC Great Cities Institute

WHAT: Echoing the voice of social justice crusader, Ida B. Wells, grandson Troy Duster speaks at UIC Great Cities Institute on the importance of continuing the struggle for justice through social activism.

Duster will argue that the struggle for justice, depends on civic engagement as the fundamental element of democracy. Yet civic engagement is often low on the agenda of Americans and only comes about when events force people to become involved and engaged.

Duster's research has focused on the social and political implications of developments in human molecular genetics. He has served as president of the American Sociological Association, chair of the Board of the Association of American Colleges and Universities, member and chair of the joint National Institutes of Health/Department of Energy Advisory Committee on Ethical, Legal and Social Issues in the Human Genome Project and on the Research Advisory Committee of the Innocence Project.
