AMID BOSTON TRAGEDY IMAGINING PEACE CONFERENCE & YOUTH CONGRESS ON PEACE OFFER SOLUTIONS TO YOUTH VIOLENCE WITH A PEACE PLATFORM Sakyong Mipham Rinpoche, International Tibetan Lama & Avid Marathon Runner In 2005 Boston Marathon & Chicago Marathons, Speaks Out With Youth & Community Leaders

WHAT: In light of the tragic events in Boston, our society needs a renewed sense of hope and an opportunity to counter acts of violence by taking action to create peace, trust and compassion in our communities and individual lives.

The Sakyong Jamgon Mipham Rinpoche, an internationally recognized spiritual leader of peace initiatives and avid marathon runner who ran in the 2005 Boston Marathon and 2006 and 2007 Chicago Marathons and authored the book *Running With The Mind Of Meditation*, will join representatives from youth advocacy groups, violence prevention organizations, and at-risk youth to address escalating youth violence and build a *Peace Platform* at a *Youth Congress on Peace*. The *Peace Platform* will be presented to Mayor Emanuel and Board President Toni Preckwinkle.

City of Chicago Mayor Rahm Emanuel and **Cook County Board President Toni Preckwinkle** will serve as Honorary Co-Chairs of the *Imagining Peace Conference*. Friday features the Sakyong's keynote, *Creating Enlightened Society*, and Saturday's **Youth Congress on Peace** will provide a progressive journey through global issues affecting peace, to systemic issues and community impact, to one's own personal relationship with peace in our families, streets, schools, workplaces, city, and region. Sunday's *Peace Practices* will focus on practices that lead to personal and societal transformation.
